Leading interior designer and art historian Edward Bulmer has created the Royal Society of Sculptors' Summer Show 2023, the exhibition showcases work from the Society's members, selected in response to the theme 'Shape of Life', with many pieces available to buy.

Champions of contemporary sculpture and the artists who make it, the Royal Society of Sculptors celebrates all forms of 3D art as **explained by director, Caroline Worthington,** "Our annual show is always a fabulous smorgasbord of different ideas and concepts, materials, and artistic disciplines, reflecting the multitude of ways individual artists interpret the theme set by the curator. We're thrilled to have Edward Bulmer on board and can't wait to see his sense of colour and design at play."

The 2023 Summer Show has returned to the Society's historic home, Dora House in South Kensington, following an extensive £1m restoration of the building's ornate facade. Edward Bulmer Natural Paint supported the renovation by supplying interior paint for the exhibition walls which is the perfect backdrop for showcasing works of art in both modern and heritage environments.

About Dora House

A unique, Grade 2 listed, creative space and a hub for decades for creatives, photographers, sculptors, painters, and architects. Built in 1820 by William Blake as a pair of Georgian semi-detached villas. It was afterwards used as a studio for photographers Elliot and Fry, before being moved into as a primary home for Cecil Thomas and his young family in 1919, it is named after his beloved wife Dora.

The red brick building is beautiful as it is distinctive with curved gables and giant windows, allowing light to flood through. Original features such as stone fireplaces adorned with Delft tiles welcome you to the reception room and salon, grand but welcoming. It since then has been an exciting and inspiring place where sculptors gather and exhibit, a place of inspiration.

This South Kensington landmark stands proudly on Old Brompton Road and has been restored championing wonderful English craftmanship with the likes of HGM Bricks and blacksmiths George James and Sons and North Kent Joinery.

Edward Bulmer has poured over 35 years of experience of interior design, restoration, and colour expertise into each tin of his eponymous paint. Creating beautiful colours backed up by ecological principles which are kind to both people and planet. Working with gentle chemistry and plant-based ingredients Edward Bulmer Natural Paint offers a sustainable alternative to modern paint which is made up mostly of petrochemical derived ingredients.

Whilst the recipes are available in over 100 colours made from pigments derived from the earth, they offer more than just choice; the paints are highly breathable and contain no harmful VOCs or microplastics. The brand are on a mission to clean up the paint industry and encourage consumers to join their movement for transparency and honesty when it comes to the declaration of ingredients in mainstream paint.

The pioneering paint brand have recently been honoured with being selected as a prestigious Walpole Brand of Tomorrow 2023 and have just been allocated B Corp status alongside winning the Grosvenor Sustainability award following the opening of the flagship showroom on Ebury Street in 2022.
