Gallery Volunteers are proactive members of our Front of House team who enhance visitors' experience at Royal Society of Sculptors' exhibitions. As well as providing a fantastic customer experience and monitoring the security of the exhibits, volunteers assist with additional marketing and administrative tasks during quieter moments in the gallery. Gallery Volunteers are central to enhancing awareness of the Royal Society of Sculptors through engagement with the historic Head Office on Old Brompton Road.

<p>What's involved?</p>	<p>Gallery Volunteers are essential in the day to day running of the gallery, they:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide a friendly welcome to visitors as they enter the Society • Are the first point of contact for visitors • Count visitors as they enter the gallery • Encourage visitors to keep in touch with the society by joining our mailing list • Encourage visitors to fill in our visitor book and to give feedback • Invigilate the gallery space, providing crucial object and site security • Adhere to top customer service standards ensuring all those who enter the Society have a fantastic visitor experience • Encourage visitors to spread the word about the Society by writing on TripAdvisor or following the Society on social media • Assist with marketing and administrative tasks on the front desk if the gallery is quiet
