



What will I need for this project?


- Assorted cardboard boxes
- Masking tape
- Scrap paper
- Emulsion / acrylic paint
- Pens
- Scissors

Step 1

Cover the table with newspaper or a bin bag to protect it.

Step 2

Start joining your cardboard boxes together with masking tape. Feel free to cut bits up and add them wherever you want.

Once your box ensemble is complete, paint all over with white paint and leave until dry (probably overnight).

Once the paint is dry, start decorating your sculpture with pens or paint, adding any architectural features you like!
